Your local library bulletin: January – June 2025

Here is a summary of what has been happening in South Gloucestershire libraries.

Supporting communities – people and place

- Over 285,000 visits were made to South Gloucestershire Libraries between 1 January and 30 June 2025.
- In that six-month period our friendly, knowledgeable staff answered more than 38,000 enquiries.
- Emersons Green Library opened its extended Children's Area in March (see below), enabling us to provide an even more exciting and welcoming space for the many local families and schools that use us regularly.
- Yate and Emersons Green Libraries, in partnership with the Council's Resettling Communities team, ran activities to celebrate the Lunar New Year
 - "Really interesting event and lovely to expose the children to different culture. We really enjoyed the craft..."
- Libraries supported Ben Zephaniah Day (April) and Pride month (June) with eye catching book displays.
- During Gypsy, Roma & Traveller History month five libraries hosted displays from the GRT Education Service who ran a successful class visit at Patchway Library "It was a very fascinating session with great engagement and a fantastic presentation"







Giving children the best start in life - children, young people and families

- <u>Fire Fighters</u> from Avon Fire & Rescue Service ran Storytimes for 566 Key Stage 1 children across our libraries. These fun sessions underpinned with a fire safety message drew plaudits from the teachers:

- All Reception Class children received their own library cards as part of our 4-year project to join up every primary school aged child. Building on that Reception Classes also visited the library for a fun session with author and illustrator Robert Starling and his sloth (puppet!)
- Our popular Rhymes Times and Storytimes continue, thanks to Town & Parish Council funding at some libraries.








Reading, literacy and culture
