**General Update** 

Little Stoke & Stoke Gifford continues to be a low crime area.

The usual ASB locations of Mead Park, 100 acre wood and Stoke Park has not suffered these past few months but with the summer approaching it is an area that will be patrolled and monitored.

Abbeywood school has not reported many issues only a few sextexting and deep nude fakes that have been investigated, NFA due to insufficient evidence. I have continued to attend regularly, engage with students and safe guarding leads.

### **Review of ASB**

Top locations

Traditionally, ASB issues increase in the summer and usually the top location we encounter is Little Stoke Player File, Mead Park, and Fox Den Road. When summer arrives, the patrol in the area increases. And we are trying to work in conjunction with the staff of the parish council regarding the parks to address the issue.
